They informed me Premiere would not renew the contract with them...</p> <p>Here is a post from the BBS about the archives:</p> <p>The OLD Art Bell Archives Just to remind those who don't know this. The older Art Bell archives, and all program prior to January 2000, were hosted and served by Broadcast.com. They were also provided to us for FREE, as Broadcast.com had advertising positions to sell on the page.</p> <p>In Jan 2000, when Broadcast.com could not come to a new contract agreement with Premiere, they broke off the prior arrangement and Premiere had to get another provider of</p>

streaming audio. Intel was chosen.

So now, Premiere has to pay Intel to provide streaming services that were previously free to us. Contrary to other posts in this thread as to the cheapness of bandwidth, you have no idea how much thousands of simultaneous streams cost.

Also, all the files that were sitting on Broadcast.com's servers, where NOT returned to Premiere. Premiere has NO archive files of the Art Bell shows. Broadcast.com did not provide them to us after the breakup. So it's not so easy to just "turn them back on."

All the previous programs would have to be RE-ENCODED, in order to be on-line. Another expensive proposition.



They had cut it back to only 30 days of archives. I burned them to CD-R, so I get an Art Bell "fix" when I truly needed it.</p> <p>With Art coming back, and seeing what happened in the past, I think this is a "heads up" to make sure we (the true Art Bell fans) archive his programs so they we don't lose them when Art leaves us again. (HOPEFULLY that won't be for a VERY loooong time!)</p> <p>There are three recording programs that I've found to be very useful:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The Real Audio Encoder that you can u/l for free. It allows you to record the live broadcast to a Real Audio file in real time. http://www.real.com

2. Total Recorder all allows you to record live internet broadcast streams and save them. Curret version is: 3.0. The \$11.95 registration fee is well worth it. You can download a shareware version from the authors website at: <http://www.highcriteria.com>

3. Scanner Recorder was written to record Police Scanner broadcasts onto your computer but is very handy for recording Radio Programs. Current version is: 1.8. And it's FREE! It can be downloaded from the authors web site at: <http://www.davee.com/scanrec/index.html>

CD-RW drives have come WAY down in price. You can get a very good drive for under \$100 if you watch for sales. And, of course, keep a eye on: <http://www.pricewatch.com>

Watching sale prices, you can get the blank CR-R's for anywhere from \$0.10 - \$0.20 each most of the time.

You can "burn" both data and audio CDs with these drives.

Anybody here have any other suggestions?

Better get ready NOW! Feb. 5th is right around the corner!!!
